MFL Lead

I have been the MFL Lead at Jeavons Wood for two years. Although I don't have a foreign languages background, I've found my degree in Education & English and masters in vocabulary acquisition extremely useful to help me to understand the importance of a build-up of grammatical and linguistic skills. I'm very excited to have started working with the MFL network across our Trust schools. We had our first network meeting and this was a great opportunity to understand the similarities and differences across

our schools and how everyone's been getting on with the teaching of MFL at home. Below is a summary of approaches across the schools:

Offord Primary (Katie Brown)

Spanish is taught by weekly by a HLTA as PPA cover. The school use the Rachel Hawkes language scheme.

Everton Heath (Jane Walker)

French is taught weekly by both class teachers and a HLTA.

Gamlingay Primary (Katie May)

Spanish is taught weekly (30 mins) and 5 minute daily inputs are also prepared by the MFL lead - these are shared across KS2. Y3&4 class teachers teach their Spanish lessons, and in Y5&6 this is taught by a teacher from Comberton Village College. The school follows the Rachel Hawkes scheme.

Hartford Juniors (Emma Whitehead)

French is taught weekly by class teachers and follow the Rachel Hawkes scheme. Jeavons Wood (Alice Evans)

Spanish is taught weekly from Y3-6. Year 3, 4 and 5 class teachers teach their Spanish lessons, and in Year 6 this is taught by a teacher from Cambourne Village College.

I hope our group will provide a useful place for advice, support and resources. Over time, we will cover assessment, raising the profile of MFL, deep dives and more. Although we teach different languages, it was brilliant to learn how we are schools share a lot of similarities!

Our next MFL meeting will take place in the Summer Term - in this meeting we will be focusing on how everyone has found the teaching of MFL after the opportunities and challenges of home learning, as well as touching on Assessment in MFL.
